Case Study- NY Field Maintenance Shop 6 (FMS 6)

The Background

In early 2006, the NY Army National Guard's FMS 6 located in Utica, NY opened their new facility complete with a wide variety of Equipto products ranging from V-Grip Shelving Systems to Work Centers and Teardown Benches. In 2008, as a result of changing missions and the need to better utilize their existing space. FMS 6's Supervisor, WO1 Mike Renwick again turned to Equipto. Beginning in early 2008 and continuing through the year, Mr. Renwick began to fully utilize the flexibility and unlimited utility of his V-Grip Shelving Systems.

The Project/Solution

After an initial site inspection by Equipto, FMS 6 began incorporating a number of options (only available with Equipto's V-Grip System) into their existing equipment. Added so far in 2008, to the shelving installed in 2006, were wide modular drawers with dividers, sliding shelf dividers, half doors, and full height doors. These new accessories have allowed the FMS 6 shop better space utilization by getting many items previously stored in separate bins and on walls into the existing shelving system resulting in a more organized shop appearance and improved inventory tracking. Additionally, inventory security has been enhanced by the half and full height locking doors. All of the work completed on site was done by the FMS 6 staff in hours. Mr. Renwick will continue adding to the capabilities of his V-Grip System though 2008 and beyond.
